For those of you I haven't met, let this be my official greeting to you as the new Transitional Pastor at the Rocky River Presbyterian Church. I'm very thankful for the many people who have been so helpful and supportive since my arrival.

I'm grateful to the Transitional Pastor Search Committee for their due diligence in bringing the search process to a completion. They are: Jayne Hoon (Chair), Dan Mckenzie, Dave Hensel, Luke Zinda, Chuck Erml, and Kathy Bast. Not only was this group helpful throughout the search, but also in helping me get on board after I arrived. I would also like to express my appreciation to Rev. Eric Dillenbeck for his service to this congregation as the "Gap" Pastor. Eric was very helpful to me in providing important information and guidance during the handoff from the "Gap" Pastor to the "Transitional" Pastor. I'm grateful as well for the ministry of Rev. Jon Fancher which he faithfully provided to this congregation for over thirty years. "Well done good and faithful servants," all of you!

Now, we turn our attention to moving forward in the search for your Installed Pastor. I would like to challenge members of this congregation to actively engage the process in the months ahead, and that you prayerfully support the Pastor Nominating Committee (once they are elected) in the work they will have in front of them. On my part, I will work hard with leaders of the church and representatives of the presbytery to move the process along in a positive direction.

I told the Transitional Pastor Search Committee that my main task as a Transitional Pastor is to prepare the way for the Installed Pastor. I've shared this with many others since arriving here as well. My primary goal is to set your Installed Pastor up for success and to enable that person to "hit the ground running" once he or she has arrived. Whatever steps we take together to clear the way for the follow-on Pastor, will benefit both the Pastor and the congregation. To do this requires us to honestly reflect on the ministry of this church and what it has been in the past, what it is now, and what, with God's guidance, this ministry will be. I'm hoping this can be an exciting time for all of us involved as we anticipate what God has in store for Rocky River's future.

I've truly appreciated the teamwork of this congregation which I have observed in the short time I've been here, and I encourage you to keep that same team spirit going throughout this ongoing period of change. Let's also remember that God is with us in times of change, and because God is present and at work within and among us, we can all look to the future with hope and joyful expectation.

# OCTOBER 22: TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST


