# Pastor's Pen

"Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick." Matthew 9:12

These are the words Jesus shared with those who criticized him because of the questionable company he kept, that is, people who were often not respected in religious circles because of their unsavory and corrupt lifestyles. In this case, the religious authorities were criticizing Jesus because he was sitting at table with a well-known scoundrel whom Jesus had called to be one of his disciples, a tax collector named Matthew. He was breaking bread with Jesus, along with Jesus's other disciples and the scoundrel-like friends of Matthew. "Why," it is asked, "does your teacher (Jesus) eat with taxcollectors and sinners?" Jesus' response is, "Those who are well have no need of a physician; only those who are sick."

We may be inclined to think Jesus is referring to the fact that these low-life's were sick people, "outsiders," and Jesus, the great physician, had come to heal them. They're sick in their addictions, their crooked lifestyles, their corruption, and their lack of any concern for what is good and righteous. Jesus, the great physician, is willing to pour out his kindness and forgiveness on these who are "sick."

Yet, Jesus wants to make it clear to those pointing their fingers at these "bad" people Jesus associated himself with that they also needed the great physician. It was as if to say, "You who believe you are well are in fact sick, and you need the healing which only the great physician can provide." Put another way, "I have not come to call the righteous, but the sinners. And guess what? That group of sinners includes you!"

The season of Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14, reminds us that we all need the Great Physician. We all belong to the "sinners" club, equal in our need for God's forgiveness, God's care, and God's love. Each of us needs the healing which only our Lord can provide. Our Savior, the Great Physician, counted us worthy, even as we were unworthy, to give his life for the ultimate healing of us all.

### WORSHIP FOR FEBRUARY:

### FEBRUARY 4: FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

On this Sunday we will look at the Miracle of the Feeding of the Five Thousand as told in the Gospel of John. While the power of Jesus is the driving force for this miracle, it's worth noting there were others who contributed to its happening as well. The text is John 6:4-14 and the Sermon is called, "Key Players in a Miracle." This is also a communion Sunday.

### FEBRUARY 11: TRANSFIGURATION OF THE

LORD: This day on the liturgical calendar describes what happened when Jesus took three of his disciples up a high mountain and was "transfigured" before them (Mark 9:2). Rev. Joyce Lawson will be preaching this Sunday at Rocky River on this Sunday and Pastor Peter will be preaching at the United Methodist Church in Chagrin Falls where Joyce is the Pastor.

**FEBRUARY 14: ASH WEDNESDAY:** <u>12:00 NOON</u> <u>AND 7:00 PM</u>: This service marks the beginning of the season of Lent, the forty days leading up to Easter. For this service we are offering the Imposition of Ashes, a sign of the cross on the forehead with ashes, to symbolize our mutual human frailty. **Note we are offering two services for Ash Wednesday.** The service at noon will be an abbreviated service in the chapel, the later service will be in the sanctuary.

**FEBRUARY 18: FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT:** This First Sunday of Lent reflects on the passage in which Jesus was tempted in the desert following his baptism (Mark 1:9-15). We are told that the Spirit drove Jesus into the desert. What is the significance of the desert in the Bible?

**FEBRUARY 28 SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT:** The message is called "Storm Clouds" and the text is Mark 8:31-38. Here Jesus makes it known that he must walk a road of sorrows to accomplish God's purpose. "Son of Man of Man must suffer many things."
