# **Rocky River Presbyterian**

#### PASTOR'S MESSAGE

#### Pastor's Pen,

"In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low, and the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plane" (Isaiah 40:3-4).

The prophet Isaiah likens the preparation for the messiah's coming to the kind of preparation you make for the coming of a king. In ancient times, when a king made a journey from one location of his kingdom to another, the people receiving him were responsible for clearing the way for his journey. They were to make a straight road, "to make the uneven ground level." This meant literally lowering hills and filling in valleys.

The visual which Isaiah portrays contains lots of activity. We see people working together and working hard to prepare the way for the arrival of their king.

These words serve as a reminder that this season of Advent, the season of hope and expectation, is not about standing still and waiting for God to come to us, it is about actively moving forward, anticipating and preparing for God's movement. It is about seeking and searching for God's presence, striving to know God's will for us, and speaking on behalf of God in a world which often does not want to hear what God has to say. There is all the difference in the world between waiting and preparing. To wait is passive; to prepare is active. The word which the prophet uses to describe how we are to get ready for the coming of the messiah is *prepare*.

Some appropriate questions for us to ask ourselves during this season are, What piece of the road of preparation are we working on this Advent? Are we being an active player in God's redemptive work or a passive onlooker? Are we standing up for the things God wants us to stand up for, or sitting down? May the prophet's words inspire our thoughts and motivate our actions.

#### WORSHIP FOR DECEMBER

#### DECEMBER 1: FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

On this First Sunday of Advent, we will begin the season of preparation for Christmas. The message is called "Filled With Expectation," and the text is Luke 3:1-6; 16. This passage speaks about the fervor surrounding the ministry of John the Baptist, the one who prepared the way for Jesus. Are we able to capture that same excitement? We will also be celebrating the sacrament of the Lord's Supper that day.

#### DECEMBER 8: SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

This Second Sunday of Advent, we will look at Luke 1:46-55, which is often referred to as the Song of Mary (Magnificat). This Song of Mary says a great deal about the kind of person Mary was and the faith she had.

DECEMBER 15: THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT Youth Christmas Program

#### DECEMBER 22: FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

On this Fourth Sunday of Advent we will look at a man who does not get much attention in the Christmas story, and that is Joseph, the earthly Father of Jesus. Even though there is not much in the Bible about him, his actions in the birth narratives show a person of great faith and humility. The passage for this day is Matthew 1:18-25

#### DECEMBER 24: CHRISTMAS EVE 5:00 PM

Our Christmas Eve worship will be *A Service of Lessons and Carols.* There will also be special music and contributions from guest musicians and soloists. Join us for the celebration of the "Word who became flesh and lived among us full of grace and truth" (John 1:14).

#### DECEMBER 29: FIRST SUNDAY AFTER CHRISTMAS

On this Sunday after Christmas we will gather in **Walker Chapel** for an informal worship service centered on Christmas Carols. More than just singing these celebrations of the birth of Jesus, we will also be looking how the carol writers were inspired to write them and how these carols have inspired others at critical moments in life and history.



Immediately following worship on December 8th we need All Hands on Deck! This year we will "Deck the Halls". We join together to decorate the church for Advent and Christmas. We can use help from all ages, so please plan to stay however long you can that day.

# Christmas Gifts to Your Church: Flowers... In His Name... Endowment

At Christmas time, we like to make a special gift in honor or memory of loved ones. Rocky River Presbyterian Church (RRPC) offers three ways to remember someone special. We print these remembrances in the Christmas Sunday bulletin.



#### The deadline for Christmas contributions is Dec.16th 2024.

1) **Holiday Flower Fund** - Contributions to the *Holiday Flower* Fund provide plants for our sanctuary (suggested minimum donation \$10 for a plant). The RRPC Deacons' sanctuary decorating group purchases adequate plants for a tasteful display. Following the last Christmas Eve service we encourage donors to pick out a plant (there will be plants of varying sizes and styles) suitable for giving to someone who is sick, shut-in or needing a lift in spirit! (Added bonus: *Flower* Fund money remaining, after buying Christmas flowers, is used for sanctuary flowers on Sundays without flower donations!)

2) In His Name (IHN) Fund - This is a discretionary fund used by the pastor to address appeals for emergency assistance, special mission support and other unmet needs within or outside of our congregation. Donations to the *IHN* Fund may be in any amount.

#### THANK YOU TO THE MISSION STUDY TEAM:

Our heartfelt thanks to those who served faithfully on the Mission Study Team this year and produced an excellent Mission Study Report which was wholeheartedly approved by the presbytery. At a special congregational meeting held on Sunday, November 24, the congregation elected the members of the Pastor Nominating Committee. This committee is the search team responsible for interviewing prospective pastors. **<u>COMMITMENT SUNDAY FOLLOW-UP</u>**: Thank you to all who submitted their 2025 pledge forms to the church. As of this date we received **56** pledge forms with the total amount pledged of **\$223,148.64**. We encourage you to turn in your form if you have not yet done so, either by mail or bringing it to church in person during office hours or Sunday worship.

#### 2025 Offering Envelopes

As we approach the new year, it is customary for us to prepare a packet of offering envelopes for each church member (individual or family unit). We realize, however, that many of you do not use the offering envelopes and/or use a limited number each year and still have an ample supply. Given that, we ask that any members that would like to receive a packet of offering envelopes to please contact the church office to "opt in" to receiving a mailed packet of envelopes. If you don't want to receive any envelopes, there is nothing further that you need to do. You may have also noticed the option to not receive offering envelopes on the 2025 Stewardship Pledge Form (opt out) – thank you to those that marked this - we are tracking these responses as well.

Any outstanding pledges or offerings intended for 2024 must be received by the church office no later than December 30 because the final count will be completed the morning of December 31st. Any offerings received after the final count is completed will be reported for 2025.




