

One of Jesus's great teaching parables involves a sower who cast seed along the ground. The sower hoped the seeds would sprout, grow, and bear good fruit. Some seeds did just that, producing a great harvest. But others, Jesus said, fell among

thorns and, though they began to grow, these good plants were quickly choked out. Jesus said the thorns were "the cares of the world and the lure of wealth" (Matthew 13:22).

In a culture where having "enough" seems to have become a never-ending pursuit, Jesus's parable remains incredibly relevant. There are many who are chasing the American dream in ways that lead to stress, anxiety, and fear—thorns that can rob us of the ability to enjoy the abundant lives of purpose that God desires for us.

All of us have struggled with these issues at various moments in life. The troubles in our communities and in our world can prompt us to hunker down and clutch hold of what we have because we fear there won't be enough to take care of ourselves. Uncertainty can lead to a mindset of scarcity. Yet, the God we worship compels us to have faith and lead a life of abundance in the face of it all. We affirm that God has been abundantly good to us, and therefore, in faith, we respond with abundance.

Our stewardship theme for the Fall and coming year is called *Enough.* It is a reminder that, despite the troubles of our time and the uncertainties we experience, God continues to provide for us. As we consider the financial costs of Rocky River's ministry for 2025, we are also given the opportunity to ponder the many blessings we have received and to appreciate what we have.

Please be on the lookout for a mailing from the church the first week of November. These mailings will also be available for pick up at the November 3 worship service, which is our All-Saints Commemoration Sunday. **Our Commitment Sunday is November 17**, which is the day we dedicate ourselves to supporting the ministry of Rocky River Church for the upcoming year. May it be a day we experience the joy of generosity.

NOVEMBER 3: ALL SAINTS SUNDAY

On this day we will be remembering the gift of the lives of members and those associated with our congregation who have passed since the previous All Saints Sunday last year. During the worship service there will be a reading of the names of the deceased and the date of their passing. The text for the sermon on this day of remembrance is Matthew 6:19-21, and the message is called "Letting Treasures Go." We will also be celebrating the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper on this day.

NOVEMBER 10: TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY AFTER PENTE-COST

On this Sunday we will reflect on the parable of Jesus referenced in Luke 12:13-21. In this parable we see the actions of a successful farmer whose land produced an abundance of crops, so much so that he has run out of room to store what the land has produced. In response to this abundance, he tears down his barns and builds bigger ones. The message for this day is called "Storing Wrongly."

NOVEMBER 17: COMMITMENT SUNDAY

The text for this Sunday when we offer our financial commitments to the church, is Luke 12:38-44 and the sermon message is called "An Honorable Woman." Please remember to bring your pledge form for the Stewardship Dedication portion of the worship service. We encourage you to join us following our worship in Fellowship Hall for an "enhanced" coffee hour time.

NOVEMBER 24: CHRIST THE KING SUNDAY/HARVEST SUNDAY

This day marks the last day of the liturgical calendar before the new liturgical year begins with the First Sunday of Advent in December. This is referred to as *Christ the King Sunday*, and as the tile implies, it is a celebration of the Lordship and Kingship of Christ. The text for this day is Luke 4:14-21 and the message is called "Disturbing Words." This is also our Harvest Sunday, the Sunday before Thanksgiving, and is a time for us to acknowledge the abundance we have received.

Parish Advisor Thoughts...

The list for Awareness of the month is many. As I reviewed them, several if not all are about medical and brain issues. In giving this thought I wonder what the root cause is? We are a world of busyness, maybe not all productive busyness. We are over stimulated with our environment. Our environment is just not outside, but it is what we choose to listen to, people we are around, our homes, our work environment and obligations. While some of these may flow smoothly for us there are times when all we feel from this is stress.

How Stress Affects The Body?

HEAD: Issues with mood, anger, depression, irritability, lack of energy, concentration problems, anxiety and panic attacks.

HEART: Increased blood pressure, fast heart- beat, increased risk of heart attack and stroke and higher cholesterol.

INTESTINES: Decreased nutrient absorption, reduced metabolism, decreased enzymatic output, increased risk for inflammatory bowel diseases, diabetes and more.

REPRODUCTION SYSTEM: Decreased testosterone and estradiol production leading to reduced fertility.

JOINTS & MUSCLES: Aches and pains, inflammation, tension, lowered bone density (propensity for osteoporosis), tightness in the shoulders and back.

SKIN: Skin problems like acne, psoriasis, eczema, dermatitis, random breakouts and skin rashes.

STOMACH: Can cause peptic ulcer disease, IBD, food allergies, stomach cramps, reflux, nausea and weight fluctuations.

PANCREAS: Results in elevated secretions of insulin, which if chronic could lead to diabetes, damaged arteries and obesity.

IMMUNE SYSTEM: Suppressed effectiveness of the immune system to battle and recover from illness. Leads to high levels of inflammation in the body, which causes a variety of chronic health conditions.


