# Pastor's Pen

During the season of Lent, we have been looking at penetrating questions from Jesus which Jesus conveyed during his ministry. These questions came about from various encounters Jesus had with people which challenged their faith and their understanding of God. We've looked at how these questions are relevant to us as well, as they cause us to reflect on what they mean for us.

Yet, I would wager, the most penetrating question which Jesus asked of all, was not made to his disciples or one of the various people he interacted with, but to God himself. On the night of Jesus's arrest, that is the night before his trial before Pilate and his crucifixion, Jesus went to a place called the Mount of Olives (otherwise known as the Garden of Gethsemane). This occurred just after Jesus had gathered his disciples in the Upper Room and provided the Last Supper, saying to them, "This is my body broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me;" then saying, "This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood" (Luke 22:19-20). Afterwards, the Gospel of Luke tells us he withdrew from them to be alone, knelt and prayed these words: "Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me" (Luke 22:42). While not stated specifically in the form of a question, clearly Jesus is asking: "Father, is there any way possible to fulfill your will than by me dying on a cross?"

The answer to this foreboding question is no. Only Jesus, the Son of God, could be the perfect sacrifice to God for our forgiveness. As Jesus, throughout his earthly life, yielded to the will of God, regardless of the consequences, he would at this critical moment submit himself to what God required him to do. In the verse which Jesus asks that he be spared of the cross – "if you are willing, remove this cup from me" – it concludes with the unbending obedience of Jesus: "Yet, not my will but yours be done" (Luke 22:42). Submission to sacrifice describes the essence of who Jesus was, and the cross was the culmination of that sacrificial life.



# **HOLY WEEK OBSERVANCES**

APRIL 13, PALM SUNDAY: The first day of Holy Week marks the triumphal entry of Jesus into the city of Jerusalem. In the days leading up to Palm Sunday, Jesus asked questions which challenged people's faith and discipleship. Now, as Jesus enters the Holy City, people are asking questions of him. "Who Is This Man? What is his purpose?" (Matthew 21:10)

APRIL 17, MAUNDY THURSDAY: On this evening we will celebrate the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, as we recall the events of the Upper Room when Jesus gathered his disciples and offered them the bread and the cup to remember his sacrifice. The word Maundy is derived from Latin word meaning command. At the Last Supper, when Jesus broke the bread, his command was that they "Do this in remembrance of me" (Luke 22:19). It is his command to us as well. Our worship will include a Service of Tenebrae (Service of Darkness), to commemorate how with the death of Jesus it appeared that the darkness had prevailed over the light. This service begins at 7:30 pm.

APRIL 20, EASTER SUNDAY: On this Day of Resurrection, the question is asked of those who came to the tomb where Jesus was buried, "Why Do You Seek the Living Among the Dead?" (Luke 24:5) The answer is that Jesus is not among the dead because he has risen! Our central affirmation as the followers of Jesus is: "Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!"

Our next topic of discussion will be Matthew Kelly's book, *Holy Moments*. The dates for this will be March 30, April 6 and 13.


The last session we have before we break for summer will be April 27, May 4, 11, and 18.





Life is about love and relationships. We are all God's children.





## ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING SPECIAL OFFERING:


