On Sunday, June 8, we will be celebrating the Day of Pentecost. This day marks the event when the power of God's spirit was poured out upon the disciples in a dramatic way, as described in the Book of Acts.

The Holy Spirit jumpstarted the dynamic movement of God in the early church. It was by the power of the Holy Spirit at work among them that they were able to convey the power of God to others. How did this little ban of disciples, with their many frailties and weaknesses, turn a world empire on its head? The answer is the power of the Holy Spirit.

I truly believe the same spirit who inspired the disciples on the Day of Pentecost is still alive among us and continues to be God's driving force among his people. The question is not whether that Spirit is present, it is a question of whether we are willing to embrace that spirit.

Perhaps we are resistant to the moving of God's spirit because the spirit of God leads us in directions we are reluctant to go. It's a common theme in the Bible when God calls people for a special purpose it is often met with resistance. When God called Moses to confront Pharaoh, his response was, "Please send someone else" (Exodus 4:13). When God called Gideon to lead his people against the Midianites, Gideon's response was, "My clan is the weakest, and I am the least in my family" (Judges 6:15). When God called Jeremiah to speak on his behalf his response was, "Truly I don't know how to speak for I am only a boy" (Jeremiah 1:6).

Yet, we will only know the strength of the Holy Spirit if we are willing to follow the direction the spirit leads us. We all need to be asking the hard questions of ourselves as to where the Spirit is prodding us to go. The power of the Holy Spirit is real, and it's up to us to embrace this spirit who calls us to do the hard things.

What might the Holy Spirit be calling us to do now?

Thank you to everyone for agreeing to volunteer for this year's Trash and Treasure Sale. Unfortunately, we did not end up with enough volunteers to hold the Trash and Treasure Sale in the traditional style.

The Mission and Evangelism Committee has considered many alternative ideas. Here are the details of what the Committee is envisioning for the Sale on October 4, 2025.

Who: Church congregation individuals/groups.

What: The individuals/groups will bring in their own items that they want to sell. They would sell their items at their table. Items could include clothing, books, housewares, holiday items, etc.

Money: Each individual/group will handle their own sales, so you will need to have change available, just like at a home garage sale.

How: Tables will be set up in the Fellowship Hall around the perimeter similar to the Alternative Christmas Bazaar. Individuals/groups will select a table on which they will set up their items for sale. Table selection will be first come – first serve.

Sale Money: All proceeds from your sales will be donated to the Mission and Evangelism Committee.


