Fastor's Ten,

Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers; for in doing so, you entertain angels unawares.

(Hebrews 13:2)

When the Bible describes the appearance of an angel, it is often a dramatic happening. I think of the picture created in the vision of Isaiah. In the prophet's vision he says, "I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs (which is another name for an angel) were in attendance above him; each had six wings; with two they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another saying, 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory'" (Isaiah 6:1-3). Or, I think of when the angel Gabriel came upon Mary, the mother of Jesus, to announce that she would bear the Christ child. "Greetings O favored one, the Lord is with you" (Luke 1.28). When we think of an angelic encounter, we think of being whisked into a world not known to us.

And yet, that is not always the way the Bible speaks about angels. In Hebrews 13 it says, "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers; for in doing so, you entertain angels unawares." Far from being something foreign and otherworldly, angels are described as beings we can meet in everyday life.

I think this is the Bible's way of saying that there are holiness opportunities when meeting the "stranger," and when we show hospitality, as Hebrews indicates, we have the chance to convey something of God's presence, love and concern to another person. My hope is that the Rocky River Church can be a place where the stranger is welcomed and made to feel a part of God's community of faith. There are many people in our neighborhood who need to know the presence of God – often without even realizing it – and we as the church are the ones God counts on to be that presence. Let this be a time to engage the "stranger," and to "entertain angels unawares."

Fiction books:

The Little Liar (Mitch Albom)

Nico has never told a lie. When the Nazis invade, the trustworthy boy is offered a chance to save his family. All he has to do is persuade his fellow Jewish residents to board trains heading "north," where new jobs await. The innocent boy reassures them on the station platform every day. When the final train is loaded, he sees his family herded into a boxcar, and only then does he discover that he has helped sent them all to Auschwitz. Nico escapes, but never tells the truth again.

The Handmaid and the Carpenter

This novel transports us to Nazareth where we meet Mary and Joseph, young and in love. For Mary, her pregnancy is a divine miracle and a privilege. For Joseph, it is an ongoing test of his faith in his wife and in his God. The author movingly takes the story of the least ordinary couple in history, and makes them more human.

<u>Trust</u>

Set in New York City and focusing on the world of finance, this is a look at a secretive financier and his wife. It is composed of 4 fictional texts: A Novel (Bonds), an incomplete autobiography (My Life), a completed memoir (A Memoir, Remembered), and a diary (Futures). While each book focuses on many of the same characters, the information included in each is often mutually exclusive, with it being left up to the reader to determine the truth. The Midnight Library

beyond the edge of the universe, there is a library containing an infinite number of books, each one the story of another reality. One tells the story of your life as it is, along with another book for the other life you could have lived if you had made a different choice at some point in your life. We all wonder how our lives might have been. What if you had the chance to go to the library and see for yourself? Would any of these other lives truly be better? (NY Times Bestseller)

<u>Wellness</u>

A witty and poignant novel about marriage, middle age, tech-obsessed health culture, and the bonds that keep people together. The author has synthesized 100 years of the American delusion called self-improvement, the broken need to fix what may not need fixing. (Oprah Book Club)

Breakfast with Buddha

When his sister tricks him into taking her guru on a trip to their childhood home, Otto, a confirmed skeptic, is not amused. Six days on the road with an enigmatic holy man who answers every question with a riddle is not what he'd planned. In an effort to westernize his passenger, he decides to show the monk some "American fun."

Jerusalem's Heart

Set in 1948, during the conflict between Jewish and Muslim forces, 9 days of fighting have passed since the new State of Israel was proclaimed. Hundreds of loyal soldiers who do not speak the same language have come together in faith and are willing to die for Israel. The leading strategist is trapped in enemy territory and races to reach those still fighting, including his pregnant wife, Rachel.

Remarkably Bright Creatures

A witty exploration of friendship and hope that traces a widow's (Tova) unlikely connection with a giant Pacific octopus, Marcellus, in the aquarium where she works. Marcellus deduces what happened the night Tova's18-year-old son vanished on a boat over 30 years ago, and tries every trick his invertebrate body can muster to unearth the truth for Tova.

The Covenant of Water

This is a stunning epic of love, faith, and medicine, set in South India, following three generations of a family seeking the answers to a strange secret. In each generation, at least one person dies by drowning. A 12-year-old girl, grieving the death of her father, is sent by boat to her wedding where she will meet her 40-year-old husband for the first time. From this beginning, she will witness unthinkable changes over the span of her extraordinary life. (Oprah Winfrey- "One of the best books I've read in my entire life.") (New York Times Bestseller)
