### **Rocky River Presbyterian Church**



"The people were restrained from bringing (their offerings); for what they had already brought was more than enough to do all the work" (Exodus 36:7).

In Chapter 36 of the Book of Exodus, the Lord says to Moses, "Tell the Israelites to take for me an offering: from all whose hearts prompt them to give you shall receive the offering for me" (Exodus 25:1-2). This offering that is initiated by God is for the purpose of building a tabernacle that

will serve as a visible, daily sign, of God's presence among his people. The tabernacle is to be a place of gathering, a place of worship for the people of God while living in the wilderness.

Keep in mind, this request is directed to a group of people who had very quickly packed and left their homes in Egypt, so none of them would have had much to give. But here in Exodus, not long after the people had left their captivity in Egypt for the freedom but also hardship of the wilderness, Moses is asked to collect an offering that reflects the people's gratitude for God's provision for them.

These were challenging and uncertain times. Food and water were scarce, opportunities to earn money were slim, but God continued to provide for their needs. So, they responded to Moses's request with generous enthusiasm. The people not only donated their time and skills to the building of the tabernacle, they gave of their possessions and their finances. Moses collected that offering and a few chapters later, in chapter 36, we are told "What they had brought was more than enough to do all the work" (Exodus 36:7).

They responded in this way because of God's grace. They realized, in this moment, that they were unworthy to be God's people, yet God claimed them as his own anyway. God was providing for them, not because they deserved it, but because God chose to love them.

On Sunday, November 9, we are giving you, members and friends of the Rocky River Presbyterian Church, the opportunity to make a similar response to God's grace. On this day we are given the chance to respond with gratefulness, knowing we do not deserve God's favor, but that God has still chosen to love us.

### **NOVEMBER 2: ALL SAINTS SUNDAY**

On this day we will be remembering the gift of the lives of members and those associated with our congregation who have passed away since the previous All Saints Sunday last year. During the worship service there will be a reading of the names of the deceased and the date of their passing. The text for the sermon is Hebrews 12:1-3, and the message is called "Saints Great and Small." We will also be celebrating the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper on this day.

### **NOVEMBER 9: COMMITMENT SUNDAY**

The text for this Sunday when we offer our financial commitments to the church is Luke 19:1-10. The sermon message is called "Claimed By Grace." Please remember to bring your Estimate of Giving Cards for the Stewardship Dedication portion of the worship service.

### **NOVEMBER 16**

Luke 15:11-32 is a familiar story about a father who had two sons, one is obedient and the other is rebellious. How the father treats each of them considering their behavior leaves us with questions. The message is called, "What Kind of Father is This?

### **NOVEMBER 23: HARVEST SUNDAY**

On this day we will welcome Rev. Joyce Lawson. She and Pastor Peter will be switching pulpits this day. This day marks the last day of the liturgical calendar before the new liturgical year begins with the First Sunday of Advent. This is also our Harvest Sunday, the Sunday before Thanksgiving, and is a time for us to acknowledge the abundance we have received.

### **NOVEMBER 30: FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT**

This First Sunday of Advent begins the season of anticipation, as we reflect on the coming of Jesus and the fulfillment of God's purpose. The text for sermon is 2 Peter 3:8-13 and the message is called, "Are We There Yet?" This day will also include a Service of Infant Baptism for Charlie Watts, the son of Eric and Hilary Watts.

Adult Education: Sundays 9:00 -10:00 AM in the West Room. Coffee and tea are available.




