From the Pastor's Pen,



During the month of October, we will be focusing on the Apostle Paul's letter to the Christian Church in Philippi. Even though this writing is only four chapters long and was written to Christians many centuries ago, it speaks volumes of spiritual wisdom for us today. Paul wrote this letter to the Philippians while he was in prison in Rome because the people in power there saw his proclamation of the Gospel as a threat. More than this, as Paul was persecuted for his faith, he was writing to the Christians in Philippi who were being persecuted for their faith. In this writing, Paul wants to encourage and inspire them to hold onto their faith and support each other during difficult times.

In the second chapter of Philippians, Paul writes, "If there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation or love, any sharing of the spirit, any compassion, make my joy complete; do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others" (Philippians 2:1-4).

These words are timeless, as they define how Christians everywhere are to minister to each other as the body of Christ and are especially meaningful for us now during this present time when there is so much division and hostility throughout the nation and the world. We may not suffer persecution and imprisonment as those early Christians did, but we all have our personal heartaches and moments of despair, whether it be because of a personal loss or disappointment, or because of the general gone wrongness of the world about us. These are the times to be encouragers of one another, looking "not your own interests but to the interests of others." These are the times to reach out to our brothers and sisters of our faith community and our neighbors who may be hurting and be for them the hope of Christ.

WORSHIP IN OCTOBER

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 5: On this first Sunday of October, we look at selected verses in Philippians Chapter One. Even though Paul writes this from prison, he is determined to be Christ's servant as best he can while in that place. His situation prompts us to ask, What do we do when we where we would rather not be? The message is called, "When In a Bad Place." This day is also World Communion Sunday, and we will be celebrating this Sacrament of our Lord.

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 12: This Sunday we turn our attention to Philippians Chapter 2, which describes Christ's perfect demonstration of humility and obedience. The message is called, "The Art of Emptying."

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 19: In Chapter Three of Philippians, Paul speaks about, "...forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead" (Philippians 3:13). What does this say about how we are to live of our Christian life?

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 26: In Chapter Four of Philippians, Paul says, "I have learned to be content with whatever I have" (Philippians 4:11). How did he manage to say this while in prison? How do we do this? The message for this day is called "Learning Contentment."

Communication With Your Doctor

"For gaining wisdom and instruction; for understanding words of insight; for receiving instruction in prudent benhavior, doing what is right and just and fair;" Proverbs 1: 2-3

Have you ever left your doctor's office, and wondered what he or she was talking about, or wished you had asked more questions? Good communication between doctors and their patients is essential to your health, and yet too many patients feel uncomfortable "bothering" the doctor with their questions or fears. Below are some helpful tips that can be of use to all of us.

If you don't understand—ASK. Medical jargon is confusing, so ask for an explanation in plain language. Medical professionals often lapse into "medical lingo" without even realizing it. Don't hesitate to stop them and remind them to use more understandable terms. The anxiety and confusion of a doctor's office can make us forget some of the things we wanted to discuss with our physician, so bring a list. It is a simple way to help you and your doctor focus.

Give the doctor all the information he/she needs to help you ~ this includes symptoms, medications, allergies, and major stressors in your life. The loss of a job or illness of a loved one can have a major impact on your health. Don't forget any over the counter medications or supplements as some of them can interact with prescriptions drugs. As little as a baby aspirin a day can cause uncontrolled bleeding after surgery, so remember that all the pills you take must be disclosed.

Tell the doctor if you are feeling rushed and think about making your next appointment for a time that isn't as busy. You can always make a "consult" appointment to just discuss what is on your mind or treatment plan.

When your doctor is explaining something, try repeating it back to make sure you understand, or take notes while you are there. You may have to be assertive and send a message via MyChart. This way all your information is kept together, and all your physicians can access your chart. A good way to find a doctor that is a good fit for you is to ask friends and relatives about health care providers with whom they feel confident. Don't be afraid to tell your health care team what you would like so you can all work together toward one goal: Better Health!




