One of the prominent images the New Testament uses to describe the church is that of a body, or more specifically the "Body of Christ." The apostle Paul said, "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many are one body, so it is with Christ" (I Corinthians 12.12). This means that Christians are related to one another as different parts of a body are related to one another, each performing a different function within that body. As Paul says, "If all were a single member, where would the body be?" Each person is able to bring his or her uniqueness to the Body of Christ.

It's important to recognize that in the Body of Christ Jesus Christ is the head, which is to say not a one of us can function in the Body of Christ without Christ, any more than an arm or a leg can function apart from the head.

During these challenging times it's also important to realize how the Body of Christ is interconnected. It is not an exaggeration to say it is just as impossible for anyone to be a Christian by himself or herself as it is for an arm or a leg to live and function apart from the rest of the body. There is no private Christianity. The Apostle Paul also said, "If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it" (I Corinthians 12:26). We are not alone. Christ is the head of the church and we are the members. Together we draw strength from one another and the one who is our ultimate hope.

An update from the RRPC Pastor Nominating Team (PNT)

We know it feels like it's taking a long time to call a new Pastor. Because of this, we want to lend some context to the complexities of the call process, as well as give you a deeper look at how our Team is approaching this work with dedication and a commitment to seek the Spirit in all our decisions. It takes a tremendous amount of patience, but with God's guidance, our Team is confident that we will find the right individual to lead our faith family.

On one hand, our focus as a Team is looking for the candidate most appropriate for our position. This candidate can articulate a vision that aligns with our mission of "Praising God, Teaching Faith, Serving Others," and our vision that "We are united in the belief that we are Christ's body on earth, and we aspire to live every day as Jesus did. Through faith, community, and mission, we strive to positively affect those we meet every day and those in our family, church, community, and in the world." For the first few months of this process, our Team was focused on creating a Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP) based on our Congregational Mission Study to attract candidates who align with that mission and vision.

On the other hand, candidates are looking for a call that aligns with their goals, professionally and personally. Primary matching occurs, initially, on a very generic level — we see a candidate's education and work background at a high level, and some narrative presentation. Only when a mutual interest is expressed is further information shared. If they are still considered a viable candidate, this may lead to a series of virtual interviews to learn more about them and to share more about our call, who we are, and our priorities. This may ultimately lead to an in-person visit here in Rocky River to meet our Team, see our Church, explore the community and partnerships, and dive deeply into our call.

In some cases along the journey, we may decide that a candidate is not a good fit for our call. Likewise, some candidates may decide that we are not a good fit for them. In some cases, they may be under consideration and/or have received a Call from another congregation while we are considering them. Through this process, we have also learned that ministry is more than "a job." It is a lifestyle with many considerations, and you are never really "off the clock." As such, there may be personal reservations about a call, considerations around relocation and work situations with a spouse or education with children, and other logistics. Calling a Pastor is truly a "God process" in that many logistical factors and the mutual leading of the Spirit must occur for a Pastor to be called.

We can end up investing a lot of time with a candidate (and they with us), only to ultimately determine that it is not a good fit. As part of our Covenant, your PNT commits to be openminded and look where God is leading us, not just relying on the normal places we find answers every day. We further commit to respecting the confidentiality of the search process, to respect one another's viewpoints, and to support one another, our candidates and our Faith Family. We have been meeting every week – sometimes up to three times a week – and each review candidates for hours weekly outside of meetings as well. We hope sharing these details about our Team's continued commitment and the challenges inherent in the process of calling a Pastor offers some insight to you all as you stand with us through this process. Your patience and your prayers for the work of our Team are truly appreciated, and know that we are moving forward with confidence and faith.




