"December is the month of tarnished

dreams." These are the words of a newspaper writer some years ago as he reflected on this particular month of the year. He writes, "The year, brightly begun in hope in January, comes straggling to this last month with many of these hopes and dreams dashed. January comes limping and beaten to December."

While I do not share this writer's sentiment as a continuing theme each year we turn the calendar page to December, I think we would all be inclined to agree that as we reflect on the preceding months of the calendar, there have been disappointments. Some have known sadness and loss. Others have experienced debilitating illness or personal tragedies. When we enter the month of December, the leaves have fallen from the trees, the flowers have faded, the sun sets earlier, and the winter chill begins to set in, and it seems to reinforce these experiences.

This is why we need the season of Advent, the season of hope and expectation. We welcome those words of the prophet Isaiah who cried out to a weary people, "Comfort, O Comfort my people... speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid." (Isaiah 40:3). The people hearing these words for the first time were a downtrodden people, crushed by violent and cruel events. Their homeland had been taken from them. Their sacred city and their temple were laid to waste, and the land which God had promised to their ancestors was handed over to a foreign power. It was to such a people that the voice of the prophet spoke words of hope.

We need to hear these encouraging words of Advent, which literally means "Coming to." God comes to us, that is, the light breaks through the darkness, the Word becomes flesh, and hope pierces despair. God in Christ doesn't avoid our troubles or our plight. He descends right into the depths of them to redeem that which has been lost. No power on earth or in heaven can reverse that. It is to these truths we must hold fast. As God's people must be, by word and deed, the *conveyor* of these convictions, speaking assurance and living in a way that demonstrates this hope.


SAVE THE DATE!


